Please have your campsite packed up and cleaned prior to 4:00 PM. This is part of Leave No Trace.

Patches: Patches will only be given out at Closing Ceremonies. If you choose to leave prior to closing ceremonies, you are responsible to make arrangements with Brent Butler to pick-up your patches before leaving.

CHECK-IN PROCEDURE

Unit leaders are to check in Friday night at the event headquarters located in the parking lot. A final

attendance roster will be requested as well as payment of any funds due. Campsites will be determined at check-in. If you wish to camp with another group, please include that information on the pre-event registration form.

MANDATORY CHECK-OUT PROCEDURE

Units are highly encouraged to stay through the Saturday conservation project. Practice good Leave No Trace habits. All campsites must be cleaned and units checked-out by 4:00 PM on Saturday.

RESTRICTED AREAS

Your cooperation is needed to keep the facility neat and clean at all times. Leaders will be provided with information on restrictions at check-in. We are only to be in our paid designated camp area. DO NOT WANDER THROUGH PEACH ORCHARDS, BUILDINGS OR BE ON OR AROUND ANY EQUIPMENT.

LEADERSHIP & PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

Participation: All youth participants are required to be registered Webelos Scouts of the Boy Scouts of America before arriving at the Webeloree.

Leadership

- Adult: The unit must provide at minimum, two-deep adult leadership on Friday night & Saturday. For each Scout camping overnight on Friday, an adult parent or parent-approved guardian is required. For boys or units that are not able to camp overnight treat it as a day camp and attend the Friday night events and return Saturday morning for the Saturday Events.
- Youth: Youth leaders are expected to set the example by living the Cub Scout Promise.

Pets: Other than specially-trained companion dogs required for a medical need or disability, no pets are allowed.

Webelos Patrol formation: If you only have one or two boys that can attend this event, they will be teamed with others to form a provisional patrol.

UNIFORM

The official BSA uniform should be worn during flag ceremonies and campfire. Honor guard members are asked to be in full and complete uniform. Your pack's activity uniform (t-shirt) may be worn during the day.

TRANSPORTATION & PARKING

All units are required to complete a BSA Tour Permit and provide their own transportation to and from the Webeloree. Please refer to the Guide for Safe Scouting for more information.

Vehicles will not be allowed to remain near the campsite, the vehicles must be parked in nearby designated parking area. Parking will be clearly defined and youth should not be found "hanging" in these areas at anytime during the weekend.

FIRES

Fires are allowed in designated fire rings in established campsites only. Absolutely no ground fires will be allowed. All ashes are to be carried out via a metal trash can or some other safe way.

Fire prevention is the key to any fire plan and should be uppermost in the minds of everyone. A healthy awareness of the potential for injury from a wildland fire, down to the touching of a hot ember should drive home the need for fire safety. No tent material is fireproof, and it can burn when exposed to heat or flame. If using tents, please follow these rules:

- Only flashlights and electric lanterns are permitted in tents. "No flame in-tent" is a rule which will be enforced.
- Chemical-fueled stoves, heaters, lanterns, lighted candles, matches or other flame sources should never be used in or near tents.
- Do not pitch tents near open fires.
- Do not use flammable chemicals near tents.
- Always extinguish cooking and campfires properly.
- No ground fires are permitted.

Use of Chemical Fuels

Only adults should have access to chemical fuels. Please store, transfer, and dispose of chemical fuels properly. Refer to the *Guide for Safe Scouting* for more information.

OTHER CAMP INFORMATION

Medical and Emergency Procedure

Units are to be prepared to provide first aid for minor injuries. Serious injuries will be directed to area medical centers. Paramedic/ambulance service is also available through the City of Queen Creek.

Trash

Each unit must pack out all trash. Please dispose of trash properly and keep area clean.

Restrooms

Please respect the use of all sanitation facilities. Units and/or individuals will be responsible for any damages or replacement to the facilities. **Keep 'em clean and honor those lady only signs!**

Water

Bring your own water. There are areas to refill your water but the campsites don't have running water.

Alcohol and Drugs

The use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances are not permitted at the Webeloree.

BSA Smoking Policy

Smoking is discouraged among adult leaders as a rule. Smoking is prohibited in all program areas, camp buildings and in a campsite where boys are present. Smoking is not permitted in the presence of boys anywhere on the camp property.
